

### Report of Library Trustees.

Of the town appropriation of \$16 80 there has been expended \$15 65 for new books and 10c. express on books sent by the state, leaving a balance of \$1 05 in the treasury. Nineteen books were purchased and six sent by the state. This makes the number of books in the library 455. The circulation this past year has been 450; a gain of 50 over the previous year.
