March 8, 1927

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.

Article 3. To see if town will vote to accept of State Aid and raise necessary money for same.

Article 4. To see if town will vote to accept State Aid on a new cement bridge.

Article 5. To see if town will vote for appropriation of \$200 for purpose of commencing the control of White Pine Blister Rust in town.

Article 6. To see if the town will limit money on town roads to \$600.00.

Article 7. To see if town will vote sufficient appropriation for observance of Old Home Day, and for appointment of proper committee of arrangements.

Article 8. To see if town will vote to purchase a road machine suitable for patrol work.

Article 9. To see if town will vote to discontinue the road leading around buildings known as A. K. Judd place.

Article 10. To see if town will vote to discontinue road from old building site to the William Lane buildings on the William Lane road.

Article 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
