TOWN MEETING WARRANT

March 13, 1928

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

Article 3. To see if the town will limit money on town roads to \$600.

Article 4. To see if town will vote to raise \$1,800 for school purposes.

Article 5. To see if town will vote to accept of State Aid and raise necessary money for same.

Article 6. To see if town will vote to accept of State Aid on new cement bridge and raise necessary money for same.

Article 7. To see if town will vote for appropriation of \$200 for purpose of commencing the control of White Pine Blister Rust in town.

Article 8. To see if town will vote sufficient appropriation for observance of Old Home Day and for appointment of proper committee of arrangements.

Article 9. To see if town will vote to discontinue road leading Lost River Road to William Oakes Place, so-called.

Article 10. To see if town will vote to pay for building road leading to W. J. Dixon's Cottage from Sugar Hill Road.

Article 11. To see if town will vote to build a cement bridge on brook below C. N. Judd residence.

Article 12. To see if town will vote to have the highway plowed in the winter; what roads, and in what manner, and make appropriations for same.

Article 13. To see what the town will vote in regard to securing electric lights from the Lisbon Light and Power Company of Lisbon, N. H.

Article 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the said meeting.
