## TOWN MEETING WARRANT

March 12, 1929

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Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year, excepting road agent.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to appoint the partolman for maintaining town roads, and make appropriations for same.

Article 4. To see if town will vote to accept State Aid and raise necessary money for same.

Article 5. To see if town will vote to accept State Aid on new cement bridge, and raise necessary money for same.

Article 6. To see if town will vote to raise and appropriate money to eradicate pine blister rust.

Article 7. To see if town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount of 2% on early payment of taxes.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to contract with the Lisbon Light and Power Company to light the streets of Easton for a period of years and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 9. To see if town will vote to have the highway plowed in the winter; what roads, and in what manner, and make appropriations for same.

Article 10. To see if town will vote sufficient appropriation for observance of 'Old Home Day and for appointment of proper committee of arrangements.

Article 11. To hear the reports of committees and agents, and to transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

This is to certify that I have examined the accounts of the Treasurer, Town Clerk, Tax Collector and Selectmen of Easton for the year ending January 31, 1929, and find all bills properly vouched.
