TOWN MEETING WARRANT

March 11, 1930

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to appoint the patrolman for maintaining town roads.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and raise necessary money for same.

Article 5. To see if town will vote to accept State Aid on new cement bridge and raise necessary money for same.

Article 6. To see if town will vote to raise and appropriate money to eradicate pine blister rust.

Article 7. To see if town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount of 2% on early payment of taxes.

Article 8. To see if town will vote to have the highway plowed in the winter, what roads, and in what manner.

Article 9. To see if town will vote sufficient appropriations for observance of Old Home Day and for appointment of proper committee of arrangements.

Article 10. To see what action the town will vote, to improve "the driveway to cemetery" and appoint committee for same.

Article 11. To hear the reports of committees and agents, and to transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

LIBRARY REPORT

This has been a good year for the library. The books loaned numbered 466. The greater number of these were fiction, but there were also a number of volumes of history, biography, poetry, science, natural history and religion. The few magazines that come annually to the library were constantly borrowed, and the librarian also lent freely of his own magazines.

The library funds which have been accumulating since 1924, \$50.00, were paid over by the town to the trustees, and of this sum \$15.00 was spent in purchasing 25 books for the library. These are all fiction including several special books for children.

A gift of 4 books was presented to the library by Mr. Floyd Guilmette of Littleton, N. H., and one was given by Mrs. Annie H. Bowles of Lexington, Mass. These gifts, and the interest shown, are greatly appreciated.
