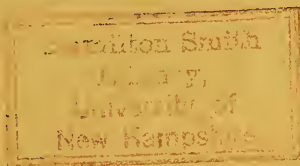

## TOWN MEETING WARRANT

March 10, 1931

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Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and raise necessary money for same.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on new cement bridge and raise necessary money for same.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to eradicate pine blister rust.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount of 2% on early payment of taxes.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to have the highways plowed in winter, what roads, and how or in what manner.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote sufficient appropriations for observance of Old Home Day and for appointments of proper committee of arrangements.

Article 9. To hear the reports of committees and agents, and to transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## LIBRARY REPORT

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The library has had a very successful year. The books loaned numbered 601. While a large number of these were fiction, yet there has been a great demand for other things, especially historical works and biography. Volumes of poetry, religion and the natural sciences were also called for in quite large numbers.

Magazines were also in constant circulation and two new Farm Journals, American Farming and Bureau Farmer, were added as free gifts from the publishers. These gifts are much appreciated. The annual town grant of \$10.00 was spent in purchasing 14 new books for the library; these include some interesting volumes other than fiction. A balance of \$35.00 remains in the bank to be used when any special need arises.

Mrs. Annie H. Bowles, of Lexington, Mass., presented the library with seven excellent volumes of fiction. We greatly appreciate this interest, and remembrance of the library.
