#### TOWN MEETING WARRANT

March 14, 1933

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the laying out, construction and repairing of highways and bridges, general expense of highway, plowing and snow removal, and for all other town charges.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on new cement bridge, and raise money for same.

Article 5, To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to erradicate pine blister rust.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to allow a discount on early payment of taxes. What per cent and at what time?

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to have its highways plowed in winter.

Article 8. To see what part of the Federal Forest Reserve Fund shall be paid to the School District, and to make any motion or cast any vote pertaining thereto.

Article 9. To see what action the town will take in regard to discontinuing the Highway leading from the Mrs. Sarah Johnnot home to the Mrs. Nancy Crabb's place, formerly called the O. E. Judd place.

Article 10. To hear the reports of committees, agents, and auditors.

Article 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### LIBRARY REPORT

The library has had a very satisfactory year.

The number of books loaned during the year was 690. Of these 210 were non-fiction, 235 were juvenile books, and 245 adult fiction. Magazines loaned, 50.

A gift of 14 books, was sent us by the Public Library Commission, (from the State Aid Fund) and are a very valuable addition to the library. Seven of these include biography, history, science and religion, and are the finest books of their kind. They are also very helpful to our high school students, as all but one are on their reading list. The remaining seven are very fine juvenile fiction. We greatly appreciate this gift.

As usual, our district school has made good use of the library, and at present a number of books are on deposit in the school. We are much pleased to have the schools make such extensive use of the library, and we stand ready o give every possible aid to teachers and students at all times.

In November we enjoyed a visit from Miss Dorothy Annable, secretary of the Public Library Commission. She was much pleased with the selection of books in this library, and the way the work is being carried on.

At the time of writing this report our annual grant of \$10.00 from the town, (required by state law) has not been received, but we expect it soon, then the usual purchase of books will be made promptly.

The present school year will close with an estimated deficit of \$269.28. This is due to the fact that we shall have to expend \$235 more for transportation than we had estimated, as we have had to transport two and sometimes three pupils from Wildwood and that our high school tuition will cost \$70 more than estimated

This increase in expenditures and a reduction in our equalized valuation will make it possible to cancel our debt to the state and obtain about \$200 state aid next year, if you approve our budget.

We recommend that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for school purposes, which is the same amount which was raised this year.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The total school enrollment last year was 26 with an average membership of 19.5 and a per cent of attendance of 93.4. There were five pupils attending Dow Academy. The enrollment this year is only sixteen. There are four pupils attending Dow Academy and one attending Portsmouth High School.

For some time the school district has owed the state about \$340 for an overpayment of state-aid money. As the result of an increased budget and a reduced equalized valuation for the town, it will be possible to get enough state aid to pay what we owe and obtain \$200 beside for next year. If you had not owed the state \$340 you would receive over \$500 from the state next year. With the same budget the following year, you would receive about \$500 from the state and need to raise \$500 less by taxation.

This year one side of the school house roof was shingled. The building is now in good repair and little needs to be spent upon it.

Miss Holmes has continued as your teacher for a second year and is doing an excellent piece of work.
