TOWN MEETING WARRANT

March 10, 1936

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the laying out, construction and repair of town highways and bridges, general expense of highways, snow removal, officers' salaries and expenses, election and registration expenses, health and other town charges.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid and raise money for same.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise additional money to furnish town building and transact any other business pertaining thereto.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to allow a discount on early payment of taxes. What per cent and at what time?
- Article 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to its highways in winter.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on new cement bridge and raise money for same.
- Article 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of road forming the southerly turn from the Brown Road, so called, to the Highway No. 116.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for defraying the town charges in anticipation of taxes.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the "Municipal Budget Act."

Article 12. To see what action the town will take in regard to hiring the Franconia Fire Truck when necessary.

Article 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

In non-fiction the calls were principally for travel and adventure, biography and history, although there were a number of nature books, fairy tales, poetry and drama.

At present the library has only one magazine, "Our Dumb Animals", but to fill the need and calls for magazines the librarian has lent his own.

As in former years, books have been lent freely to the schools and special privileges given to teachers. A deposit of books has been almost constantly in the district school, and a total of 125 books were loaned to that school during the year as well as a number of books to our students in high school. Teachers and students have expressed themselves as very much pleased with our selection of books for children and young people.

The circulation of books was not quite as large as in the previous year, owing largely to the fact that some ten people who were constant readers, moved away from Easton during the year. Also we did not have the State Aid books for 1935, and consequently there were not so many new books to put in circulation.

We are happy to announce that we are to have \$50 worth of books from the State Aid Fund during 1936. This large amount is being given to make up for our

1935 loss, as well as our grant for 1936. We are deeply grateful for this generous gift.

With the town appropriation of \$10 (required by State law) 15 books were ordered for the library and Mrs. Annie H. Bowles who still retains her interest in this library, sent a gift of five books. This gift is much appreciated.

The librarian has endeavored to carry on and keep the library up to standard even though, through lack of funds, there are many things needed to make the service more efficient. As has been stated in a former report a library is second only to the schools in educational value to the community.

The librarian is grateful for the many expressions of appreciation from the readers, for the library service.

This is the peoples library and the librarian wishes every one to use it greely. Our object is to get people to read and to give the best possible service. The library is kept open from 9 a. m. to 9 p. m. daily, Sundays included, and readers and visitors are welcomed at all hours.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Easton:

The total school enrollment last year was 18 with an average membership of 14.5 and a percent of attendance of 96.7. The later was two percent greater that of the previous year. There were 15 cases of tardiness. Five pupils attended Dow Academy. The enrollment this year is now 12. There are two pupils attending Dow Academy.

Miss Janet Plummer of Plymouth replaced Miss Blanchard as teacher. Miss Plummer was a graduate of Plymouth Normal School last June. She is doing a good piece of work as a teacher.

Last year enough money was raised through entertainments to purchase a piano. This has been a great help in teaching music and in giving entertainments.

This winter Miss Plummer has, with the assistance of both pupils and parents, provided a hot dish of food to supplement the noon lunch.

The School Board is asking for an appropriation of \$1,100 for next year. This is \$100 less than that for the past year. The reduction has been made possible in part by the discontinuance of transportation to Wildwood.
