- Article 5. To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to allow discount for early payment of taxes. What percent and at what time?
- Article 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to its highways in winter.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for defraying the town charges in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for the eradication and control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

Article 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

History headed the list in non-fiction, with biography, travel, adventure and poetry following closely. The children read a good many nature books. The new picture scripts are found very interesting.

It has been pleasing to note how the juvenile readers, from the small children up to high school age, have appeared to enjoy coming to the library. They are so enthusiastic.

Our readers are still expressing a desire for more magazines. We have not had the American Magazine and American Homes since the August issues, and they are greatly missed.

During the year 19 books were purchased for the library, and 16 came as a gift from the Public Library Commission State Aid Fund.

We have continued to co-operate with the schools in supplying books and giving teachers and students special privileges and consideration.

In 1934, and again in 1936, the librarian expressed a desire to resign and give up the library, but as the library patrons and the Public Library Commission strongly urged him to remain, he continued to serve.

Once more, in September 1938, he declared his intention to resign at the end of the month, but again those who use and enjoy the library were most insistent that he remain. This is the only reason why he did not resign.

He wishes here to thank those friends for their many kind expressions of appreciation.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Easton:

The total enrollment in your school last year was 15, with an average membership of the same number, and a percent of attendance of 94.01%. There were 9 cases of tardiness. This was an increase of two pupils in enrollment and nearly 2% in attendance over the previous year. One pupil was attending Dow Academy. The enrollment this year is 15, with only one pupil in the eighth grade. There are four pupils attending Dow Academy.

Your school has been rather upset this year due to the illness of Mrs. Bowles and an epidemic of whooping cough. In order to make up the week lost in January, it has seemed best to omit the February vacation and have the next vacation the week of March 27th.

It will be necessary to increase your appropriation for next year, as the estimated balance at the end of this year will be much smaller than that of last year.

There is a special article in the warrant to see if the District will vote to put a new ceiling on the school room. The present ceiling is a metal one and it is almost impossible to prevent the paint from peeling off it with changes in the temperature of the room. A new ceiling made from insulating board would also make the room much warmer.
